### Three Truths about Trust

1. Trust \_\_\_\_\_ our perspective.

2. Trust \_\_\_\_\_ how we life.

- Trust \_\_\_\_\_ our view.

“Trust in the Lord with *all* your heart and lean not on your own understanding. In *all* your ways acknowledge Him and he will make your paths straight.” Proverbs 3:5

- Why do you think David was so sure he was doing the right thing? How did he know God didn’t give him this opportunity to kill Saul?
- All words have “connotations.” Are there different connotations to the words “faith” and “trust?” If so, what’s the difference?
- How does our society use the word “faith” when it comes to spiritual things?
- How does trust in God color our perspective? (i.e. How does trust make us look at life differently?)
- Does trust in God always involve risk?

### Questions for Reflection and Application:

- In the message, Kory said we tend to “diversify our faith.” What did he mean by that?
- Where do you diversify your faith? (i.e. where do you “invest” your trust?)

### Read 1 Samuel 24

- What was David’s reason for not killing Saul when he had the chance?
- If you were David, what would you have said to your men who saw the situation as a God-given opportunity to become king?
- How does David’s action show complete trust in God?

In the message Kory said, “Biblical trust is not a response to evidence, it’s a response to the character of God.”

- What’s the difference between trust in evidence and trust in the character of God?
- How does trust in evidence limit us?
- What is an area where you need to trust God right now?
- What’s keeping you from complete trust?
- How would your life look different if you did completely trust God?
