 - Crisis moments in your life; the loss of a friend or family member, a life-changing diagnosis, a struggling marriage or divorce, a major life change, or a time of personal failure.
 - How was God present in your life at the time?
 - How did the church come through for you?
3. In what ways has your faith grown over the years?
 - How is your character different today than when you were younger? What was the catalyst for that change?
